US Withdrawal from Afghanistan: Its Political Impacts on Pakistan

The study has highlighted the impacts like increased in terrorism and extremist activities in both Afghanistan and Pakistan, as the Taliban and other extremist groups have filled the vacuum left by the departure of US forces. Hence, this led to destabilization of the region, with unfavorable political effects on Pakistan. The study aims to highlight far-reaching political impacts on Pakistan of withdrawal of US forces from Afghanistan. The research is purely qualitative and secondary sources are used to collect data. The paper specifically discusses peace and stability in the region and does not cover the political and economic factors which are very important factors.

Shaffan et al., (2020) in their study discussed, the presence and impacts of military on Policies, how the US Defence Diplomacy is working in Afghanistan. The long-running war on terror and the shift in global dominance have had a significant impact on US foreign policy. It has dealt a blow to global political, economic, and diplomatic relations, leading to greater militarization and securitization of American foreign policy. Civil-military tensions have shifted as a result of post-9/11 variances in military-related policies to report these shifting security conditions. This study focuses on the military role of USA in Afghanistan and the consequences and their impacts.

In another study by Paliwal, (2019), the role of India is being explained as it is one of the emerging regional power and a good neighbor of Afghanistan, so closely examining the past relation between Pakistan and India in the light of current withdrawal and a cautious balance—explaining India's approach toward Afghanistan's peace process as it is one of the biggest Asian security concerns.

Afghanistan is known as the grave yard of the empires as many great empires tried to conquer it but failed in one way or the other. Recent example is of US who tried to control this land and in turn have to suffer heavy losses in terms of men and money. Thus,

US evacuated Afghanistan and withdrew all its soldiers leaving a power gap in Afghanistan. Pakistan is being on the crossroads as being an ally of US and neighbor of Afghanistan is suffering in terms of geo strategic positions and the wave of terrorism (Habib, 2018).

Evacuation of US citizens and Afghan allies
